My baby turned 4 months old in April and is due for his 4-month-old shots (RV, DTaP, Hib, PCV13, IPV).  My daughter turned one in March and is due for her 12-month-old shots (Hep B, Hib, PCV13, IPV, Flu, MMR, Varicella, Hep A).  My son is turning 11 in June and is due for these shots that are needed for 7th grade school registration: Tdap, HPV, MCV4.  My daughter is 16 and is due for her annual physical, her flu shot, her second Gardasil shot (HPV), and her 2nd meningococcal shot (MCV4), and Men B.	Pediatric vaccinations are delayed until further notice.  The clinic is vaccinating some patients; however, it is provider specific on who they will agree to see. Parents should be patient and know that their child's vaccinations may be late, however, schools, and universities should be understanding of the situation. Patients can either wait or call their primary provider; if they do not have a primary provider, patients can ask their insurance company for a referral to a provider that is currently giving vaccinations. My dad is 70 years old and needs his second shingles shot (RZV, also known as Shingrix).  Because of COVID-19, what do I do?	Most vaccinations are delayed until further notice. The pharmacy may still provide certain vaccines (flu, pneumonia, Tdap), but this may vary by pharmacy; call the community pharmacy to make appointments as needed.  Walgreens, 9700 Menaul Blvd NE (505) 299-954	(pneumonia, shingles, etc.) are delayed for now, however, essential vaccines (Tdap for pregnant women) are being kept on schedule. Patients should call the clinic to make appointments as needed.  Wyoming (505) 462-6600	delayed until further notice. Patients can wait or call their provider; if they do not have a provider, patients can ask their insurance company for a referral to a provider that is currently giving vaccinations.  Midtown Public Health Office, (505) 841-4100	delayed until further notice.  North Valley Medical Center (505) 345-3244  South Valley Medical Center (505) 873-7400

**NOTE:** If a dose in a vaccine series is given late, it is not necessary to restart the series. Vaccine booster doses can be given at later than minimum interval, but not earlier, i.e., the shingles vaccine series does not need to be restarted if the second dose is delayed past the recommended interval. A late vaccine is still valid.
